MEETING MINUTES FOR THE REGULAR MEETING & PUBLIC HEARING OF THE THATCHER TOWN COUNCIL JULY 17, 2023

Welcome and Call Meeting to Order at 6:30 p.m. by Vice Mayor Howard and she stated that this is a public meeting of the Thatcher Town Council. She stated that we do have a quorum.

Pledge of Allegiance led by Councilman Welker.

<u>AGENDA</u>

2. OPEN CALL TO THE PUBLIC: None

3. PUBLIC APPEARANCES:

A. Debbie Turley - Pickleball Courts

Debbie Turley asked the council to consider adding additional pickleball courts to the Recreation Complex. She explained how pickleball is becoming more popular and how it is a sport that is bringing the community together. There were lots of supporters in attendance. Mrs. Turley also provided the council with photos.

The council agreed to add this information as an agenda item for the next Work Session meeting.

4. CONSENT AGENDA: Action Item

- A. Approve Minutes of the June 19, 2023, Regular Council Meeting.
- B. Planning and Zoning Monthly Report.

Vice Mayor Howard asked if Mr. Brown could recap the year-end information from the financial report.

Councilmember Carlton made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda and seconded by Councilmember Welker. Motion carried unanimously.

5. OLD BUSINESS:

A. Fire Department Pay per Call / Meetings

Mr. Brown stated that Mayor Bryce and Councilman Vining met with the Fire Department heads to discuss this item in detail. The meeting discussion included talks about paying each firefighter \$20 per call and \$20 per meeting, paying the Fire Chief \$2,000 per month, and discussed increasing the fire pension fund from \$5,000 to \$15,000. Mr. Brown stated that these payments total approximately \$75,000. Councilmember Vining spoke about the condition of the Fire Department building and stated that there are needed improvements, and this should be discussed in the future.

Councilmember Vining made a motion to move \$100,000 out of the contingency fund to pay volunteer firefighters \$20 per call and \$20 per meeting, pay \$25,000 yearly to the Fire Chief, and add \$10,000 to the fire pension fund and seconded by Councilmember McEuen. Motion carried unanimously.

6. NEW BUSINESS: Discussion, consideration, and possible action

A. Approval Extension of Copper Valley Farms Subdivision

Mr. Brown stated that this is the Ben Allred subdivision on Reay Lane that was approved 2 years ago and is in the construction process. Mr. Allred has submitted a letter to the Council to renew the approval.

Councilmember Welker made a motion to approve the extension of Copper Valley Farms Subdivision as discussed and seconded by Councilmember Vining. Motion carried unanimously.

B. Fire Chief Appointment

Mr. Brown announced that the Fire Department has voted and recommended interim Fire Chief Steve Curtis as the new Fire Chief. The Fire Department has asked the Council to consider the recommendation and make the appointment official.

Councilmember Carlton made a motion to appoint Steve Curtis as Fire Department Chief and seconded by Councilmember McEuen. Motion carried unanimously.

C. ADOT IGA 23-0009287 for 8th Street Re-Construction

Mr. Brown stated that this is the IGA between the Town and ADOT for most needed re-construction of 8th Street. ADOT will provide \$4,526,400 in funds and the Town will match the remaining funds to total an amount of \$5 million. Mr. Brown stated that then the Town will reconstruct the road as reported in the application provided to ADOT. The IGA has been reviewed by the Town Attorney Matt Clifford.

Councilmember Carlton made a motion to approve ADOT IGA 23-000987 for 8th Street Re-Construction and seconded by Councilmember McEuen. Motion carried unanimously.

D. Thatcher Unified School Dist. IGA 2023-07-17 for School Resource Officer
Mr. Brown stated that last year the Thatcher Unified School District received a grant that paid this IGA 100%.
This year the school did not receive the grant. Thatcher Unified School District has agreed to pay \$50,000 towards the salaries and benefits for the School Resource Officer as stated in the IGA. The school and Town agree this will allow the program to continue, which are both in approval of. Officer Arbizo is designated as the School Resource Officer and when school is not in session he will be designated as a regular officer.

Councilmember Carlton made a motion to approve Thatcher Unified School District IGA 2023-07-17 for School Resource Officer and seconded by Councilmember Smith. Motion carried unanimously.

E. Arizona School Risk Retention Trust, Inc. Facility Use Agreement Between TUSD and the Town of Thatcher Mr. Brown stated that the Town has used the school's facilities for many years for some of our recreation leagues. There has not been a formal agreement in place for the use of the facilities. The Town would follow the schools' rental rates. This would be approximately \$10,000 for this year. This IGA is based on an annual review and has been reviewed by Town Attorney Matt Clifford. Staff recommends approval of this IGA.

Councilmember Smith made a motion to approve the Arizona School Risk Retention Trust, Inc. Use Agreement between TUSD and the Town of Thatcher and seconded by Councilmember Carlton. Motion carried unanimously.

7. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

- A. Town Manager's Report
 - Public Works Department Landscape rock and boulders have been placed at the Recreation Complex.

Crews have finished the work on High School Avenue. They have been busy with sewer taps and potholes. They have also finished the fencing on 1st Avenue.

The event went well, and everyone was thanked.

Commitment from there is still in place and they will begin moving forward soon.

Grant Opportunities

Applications have been submitted to United Way for \$200,000 and FMI for \$100,000 towards the soccer field lighting at the Recreation Complex.

The Diamondbacks grant is in process and is due July 31st. These funds will be for baseball field construction at the Platt property.

Chief Woods stated that our K9 officer is in training this week. He reported back on the weeklong FBI course he attended in Virginia.

• Fire Department

Chief Curtis thanked the Council for approving the funds for pay outs to the Firefighters. He said they will be doing some house cleaning with their bylaws. Chief Curtis also discussed the recent house burn fires that were done for training purposes. The Chief referred to one of the firefighters for an explanation of the training and how he learned from it.

Josh Curtis announced that the Fire Department was awarded a grant from AgWest Farm Credit for \$100,000 that will be used toward radio equipment.

B. Council Reports

Vice Mayor Howard mentioned that there is more funding that will be available from RTAC and SEAGO.

Transmission & Distribution Services LLC (T&D) respectfully submits this proposal dated June 26, 2023 (Proposal) to Graham County Electric Cooperative (GCEC) for Professional Engineering Services for its Reay Lane Substation Project (Project).

The Project includes the design and engineering services for a new 12/16/20 MVA, 69/12.47 kV distribution substation to replace the existing New Thatcher Substation. The Project has an anticipated design completion date of year end 2023. T&D's anticipated scope of work and deliverables are described in the GCEC provided Scope Document and Project Management Plan for the Project dated June 1st, 2023. P&C Scope:

The proposed Reay Lane Substation will have a Protection and Control (P&C) system similar to the Talley Substation which will align with AEPCO standards for protection and SCADA. Transformer primary protection will consist of a SEL-387 differential relay while the 15kV bus primary protection will be comprised of a SEL-487B relay. Transformer and 15kV bus backup overcurrent protection will utilize SEL-351S relays. The 15kV feeder protection includes SEL-651S relays to be located on the recloser stands in the yard. The station annunciator will be a SEL-2523 or similar type device.

Breaker/recloser control will be via pistol grip style control handles located inside the control building. Each control switch will be capable of SCADA control as well with a typical 'Push/Pull' feature that can Enable/Disable SCADA similar to the type employed at other GCEC stations.

Metering for the 15kV bus will include both a panel meter and redundant kWh meters with one kWh meter for GCEC and one for AEPCO. The panel meter will serve for local and SCADA indication while the kWh meter will serve for billing and record keeping. The 15kV feeder metering will be a single panel/SCADA meter and a single kWh meter. T&D will work with both GCEC and AEPCO on preferred metering types and unique application details.

The SCADA system will be included in the design and will be based on AEPCO input and design requirements. The anticipated communication path will be an AEPCO prescribed radio transceiver, similar to the existing Talley Substation.

Aside from the 15kV recloser relays, all other protection and control equipment will be mounted in free standing panels located inside the control building. The protection and control system will be powered by the station's 125V DC battery system.

T&D anticipates preparing complete relay, metering and control panel drawings for the Project, including detailed wiring diagrams and construction details, to ensure GCEC understands exactly what it will receive in the fabricated product. We believe that this approach is of greater value to our clients as compared to simply preparing a one-line diagram from which a panel manufacturer will develop a drawing package. While the up-front engineering design costs may be less when having a panel manufacturer prepare the drawings, the final product is typically far less desirable both in terms of initial installation and future additions/modifications.

P&C Assumptions and Exclusions:

- 1. 69kV line protection anticipated to be step distance and backup overcurrent. Line differential design is excluded from the design package.
- 2. AEPCO to provide standards, details and documentation for preferred protection system and for the SCADA system connection points. T&D's SCADA design scope is limited to remote control of the high side breaker similar to the Talley Substation. Additional SCADA/RTU design/detailing is excluded.
- 3. Fiber optic communications channel design to GCEC headquarters and/or AEPCO operations is excluded.

Station Scope:

The proposed new station will be as outlined in the scope document provided by GCEC and will incorporate the Owner-furnished equipment as listed. T&D is the Engineer of Record for the Talley Substation completed in 2013. As the Talley Substation is listed as the 'go-by' for use in the Reay Lane Station Design, T&D will use our knowledge of the Talley Substation details to achieve a best value design option for GCEC both in terms of cost and design timeline.

The horizontal main and transfer type bus configuration will be designed similar to the Talley Substation and will be comprised of similar steel structures, components and layout.

GCEC has always been ahead of the game when it comes to provision of equipment for its substation projects including station transformers, reclosers, breakers and regulators. T&D takes no exception to the incorporation of the Owner-furnished equipment listed in the Project scope of work. The control building is anticipated to be either metal construction or pre-cast concrete pending GCEC's preference with either a pier or slab-on-grade foundation, as required by the vendor selected. T&D will prepare conceptual drawings and specifications for this item to be used to solicit bids from vendors and work with the selected vendor on submittals as needed.

Similar to the relaying, metering and control design package, T&D will prepare a complete steel and foundation design package, including steel fabrication drawings, material lists and fastener details as well as complete reinforcement and anchor bolt design. Design analysis details, based on the information provided in the geotechnical study recommendations, are included in our Proposal for foundation and steel packages.

Station grounding and lightning shielding design analysis are also included in our design Proposal. This design will be prepared using the University of Georgia's WinIGS software package. Both the grounding design and the lightning shielding details will be similar to that found at the Tally Substation including exothermic connections and static masts with spline ball type lightning eliminators. Station deadend connections will also utilize shield wire connections.

Stations Assumptions and Exclusions:

- The proposed Project design criteria and basis of design will be in accordance with previous GCEC station projects and tailored for the unique Project location. T&D's designs are based on established IEEE/RUS and NESC design methodologies, recommendations and rules, as well as client supplemental engineering preferences, as may be applicable such as station specific signage or labelling.
- 2. T&D's electrical design package is prepared based on an AutoCAD 3D model of the proposed station. This model can then be utilized to prepare elevations, sections, details, and material lists. The design packages will be straightforward and clear, similar to other GCEC projects. A full station bill of materials is included in our design package with individual item callouts to connect the material list to the drawings.

- 3. Beyond the detailed drawing package that illustrates the station design, a robust construction specification package is included in our design package offering. The specifications will address perimeter fence installation, erection, concrete, relay/meter/control panels and materials as applicable.
- 4. Distribution bus design to include horizontal, main and transfer bus using standard shape steel members or I-beam designs, similar to the Talley Substation design package. Complete structure drawings/erection drawings and details are included in our offering.
- 5. Geotechnical boring and site resistivity testing costs are excluded from T&D's proposal. T&D is willing to prepare a specification and solicit bids for these services to provide a recommendation to GCEC. GCEC to coordinate with the Geotechnical firm to schedule and conduct all site activities. Note that the timing of design submittals, including foundation and grounding details, is based on information from these studies. Delays in providing this data could impact timing of deliverables.
- 6. Foundation design is limited to simple drilled piers, slabs on grade with over-excavation or castin-place concrete designs. Retaining walls, concrete reinforced diversion features such as the one at Talley Substation, and/or specialized foundations necessitated due to poor soil conditions are excluded and may become a change order should they be required.
- 7. Station major material bidding is anticipated to be a joint effort between GCEC and T&D. Items such as the control building, relay panels, structural steel and other long lead time equipment such as switches, insulators, etc. can be solicited based on a mutually agreed upon list prepared in conjunction with GCEC's schedule and procurement desires. T&D maintains a list of qualified bidders for these items and we can prepare a recommendation to GCEC for procurement. Items can be solicited by GCEC or by T&D based on a part number specified or equipment specifications. T&D will provide and/or review bids received by GCEC but will not be responsible for solicitation of the bids from vendors or distributors unless asked to do so. T&D excludes any purchase/procurement of materials for the Project.
- 8. Station construction labor bidding/procurement, construction review and related commissioning/testing services will be conducted by GCEC with limited oversight by T&D.
- 9. GCEC has indicated that no commissioning services are required for the design scope of the Project. In addition to providing relay/meter data files for GCEC to use in meter and relay programming, T&D offers limited remote support for Project commissioning.
- 10. Site surveying is limited to two visits. The first is to collect a site topographical survey of the GCEC property and surrounding station area. The second is to establish Project survey control monuments such as baselines, benchmark elevations, and fence corners. Construction surveying is excluded.
- 11. Site civil designs including grading/drainage drawings and details are included in the proposed design package. As the site is well established, it is anticipated that significant drainage improvements will not be required. Lime stabilization of the aggregate base (4") for the station

area, including three feet beyond the disturbed area, will be included in the design details as stipulated. Environmental, archaeological, biological reviews/permits, or any related documentation for the Project are excluded.

- 12. T&D anticipates 50%/90%/IFC Project submittal packages with electronic reviews for each. Client comments will be addressed for each review. A site visit is included for the Project design kickoff meeting. As this Proposal is for design services only, we have not included construction related site visits but are willing to provide these services at our standard rates.
- 13. 69kV transmission line design for the proposed station is limited to the description provided in the GCEC scope section. Design details for the two new 69kV switch poles and the tapped span of conductor into the new station will be included in our package.
- 14. Distribution line/underground feeder design is limited to the three (3) underground feeders which will be prepared in a similar fashion to the Talley Substation and as described in the current Project scope. Drawings/details for risers located outside of the station fence are excluded.
- 15. Demolition drawings/details requirements for the existing station were not addressed in the Project scope document and are excluded from T&D's Proposal.
- 16. While T&D anticipates the need to interface with AEPCO to review Project details, we anticipate interaction to be limited. Should extended meetings be required to coordinate efforts, a change order may become necessary to cover the additional costs.

Proposed Schedule:

Given a notice to proceed of August 1st, and pending availability of geotechnical information for the site, T&D anticipates the following submittal schedule. Note that this conceptual schedule is subject to modification if needed to facilitate GCEC requirements or board meeting deadlines.

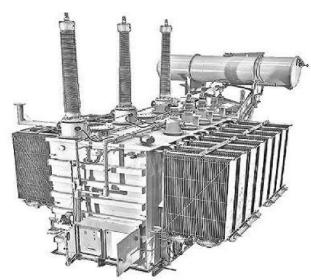
